Port of Ushuaia

Located at 54°49'S, 68°17'W, the Port of Ushuaia has been chosen by most tour operators as the gateway to the Antarctic Peninsula. It is also used by cargo ships, catcher vessels, and oceanographic and polar logistics ships. It is made out of concrete, and located in the Northwest area of the Bay and South-Southeast oriented. The new premises were opened on March 14th 1999 and it currently has the following characteristics:

Orión Plant Pier



In the city of Ushuaia there is also a fuel storage plant owned by Repsol-YPF and called 'ORIÓN' Terminal. On its banks a pier for the loading and unloading of said product was built. It has a 35-foot depth, and is located at about 350 metres east of the commercial pier. It is a concrete platform, 35 metres long and 15 metres wide, and is mounted on 42 steel piles that have a 400 mm diameter and an 8

mm thickness, and they are used with jackets concreted with inside reinforcement iron. The platform connects with the coast through a viaduct. Commercially, this pier operates with goods such as hydrocarbons: derivatives such as gas oil and fuel oil, and gasoline.


Ushuaia International Airport Malvinas Argentinas



Ushuaia International airport renders all the services necessary for air operations to Antarctica. The runway and the taxiway were designed bearing in mind a Boeing 747 as critical aircraft. The apron allows the simultaneous operation of two aircrafts of high capacity (B 747 – A340), two aircrafts of average capacity (MD80 – B737), and two of lower capacity (F27 – SW4).

INTERNATIONAL ANTARCTIC AREA



It is a conceptual project included as a major priority in Argentina's 2016 Territorial Strategic Plan. Currently under planning, it aims at articulating through geographic position of Ushuaia, its infrastructure availability and its current and prospective capacities, to offer the international Antarctic community efficient platform in terms of operations, logistics, science

and education, as well as to honour the principles consecrated by the Antarctic Treaty System.

The conceptual project named 'International Antarctic Area' to be developed in the peninsular zone of Ushuaia comprises:

- ✓ An international airport suitable for all kinds of aircrafts (existing)
- ✓ A multipurpose logistic pier (to be built) 1,000 m away from the airport
- ✓ A fuel and lubricant plant (enlargement of current facilities)
- ✓ A Unified International Antarctic Duty Free Area for goods arriving by sea or by air (to be built)
- ✓ A scientific-academic pole (enlargement of CONICET-Southern Scientific Research Council)
- ✓ An Antarctic theme park (to be built)
- ✓ A navy repair workshop



Likewise, the project promotes the creation in Tierra del Fuego of a network of highly specialized Antarctic goods and services suppliers that would allow the increase and enhancement of scientific research in Antarctica with a considerable reduction in operation costs for Antarctic

programme managers and logistics operators.

SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATION PLATFORM IN ANTARCTIC SECTOR

The Argentine Navy provides services highly appreciated by tourist and logistics ships from all over the world sailing in Antarctic waters.

It is the maritime national SAR (Air Rescue Service) authority in the Antarctic sector through the Southern Navy Area Commando Unit, and it coordinates search and rescue activities (MRCC) in a wide area that extends from 50° S to the South pole, and between



10° W and 74° W, traversing the polygon of the peace and friendship treaty, and as from 58°21′.1 S.

From its base in Ushuaia, its main activities are:

- ✓ Maritime search and rescue (SAR)
- ✓ Search and salvage operations (MRCC)
- ✓ In the summer season, the Southern Navy Area counts on a ship for support, rescue, salvage and prevention of ecological contingencies that is stationed in Antarctica.
- ✓ Every year, between December 1st and March 1st, together with the CHILEAN NAVY, the Joint Navy Antarctic Patrolling is carried out to perform activities connected with search, rescue, maritime salvage, and pollution control, with the aim of increasing and enhancing the measures of mutual trust, professional exchange, and the joint action of both Navies and of safeguarding sailing and human life at sea, and of contributing to the preservation of waters against pollution. These activities are carried out within the area of the Antarctic Treaty, South of Parallel 60° S, in the zone limited by Parallel 60° S and by Meridians 10° W and 131° W.
- ✓ It also provides support to the Summer Antarctic Campaign that is conducted every year by the Antarctic Navy Commando Unit which depends on the Southern Navy Area.

SCIENTIFIC PLATFORM



CADIC (Southern Scientific Research Council) is a regional council that belongs to Argentina's National Council of Scientific and Technological Research, the main organization in the country devoted to scientific and technological research.

Created in 1969, its founders viewed a research platform to take advantage of the special geographical location of Tierra del Fuego. Actually, the privileged location of the province, as the land closest to Antarctica, allows CADIC to have a unique position as a platform for the research of Antarctic and Sub-Antarctic natural phenomena.

CADIC researches have contributed to broaden the knowledge applied to the protection of the environment and of its related ecosystems. Such an achievement was possible due to various lines of work. The following is a list of the main lines of work connected with the Antarctic and Sub-Antarctic environments:

- ✓ Biology of Antarctic and Sub-Antarctic crustaceans
- ✓ Eco-physiology of Antarctic and Sub-Antarctic fishes
- ✓ Population and trophic ecology of Sub-Antarctic and Antarctic bird and marine mammals
- ✓ Effects of antrophic factors in the population dynamics of bird and marine mammals
- ✓ Effects of ultraviolet radiation in ecosystems
- ✓ Effects of the environmental variability in the population and communities dynamics, procurement of resources and distribution patterns
- ✓ Development of criteria and tools for the handling of species, resources use and criteria for the creation of Protected Areas
- ✓ Stratigraphy, paleontology and sediment study of the Jurassic-Cretaceous and of the Cenozoic, of Patagonia and Antarctica
- ✓ Phylogeny of Antarctic and Sub-Antarctic fishes
- ✓ Impact of the global climate change on the glaciers of the Antarctica Peninsula
- ✓ Trophic modelling of marine and terrestrial ecosystems.
- ✓ Follow-up and evolution of the ozone layer in the Southern hemisphere

Through these lines of research, CADIC works with organizations from all over the world that acknowledge the importance of the development of scientific activities in the southern tip of South America and in Antarctica.

On the other hand, the global Atmospheric Surveillance Station (VAG), as part of a worldwide network, carries out important ozone measurements.



The End of the World Museum also exhibits distinguished testimonies of the Fueguian participation in Antarctica, and it performs an important cultural role.

It is located in two historical and emblematic buildings of the city and it is the oldest museum of the province. It is actually located in the Former **Provincial** Government House, National Historical Monument, and it shows a exhibition permanent devoted to the history and

everyday life of old Ushuaia. The museum has also become a popular place for itinerary exhibitions.



Within the heritage of the museum there is a wide variety of collections, among which the most outstanding ones are the Theme Archives, the Archaeological Collection, the Audiovisual Archives, and the Library.

In the library there is the Reserved Collection, which includes original editions of books published between the XVII c. and the beginning of the XX c. All the books refer to journeys and explorations of

the southern seas (Wedell, Ross, Sobral, among others).

The museum develops an intensive extracurricular education program through workshops opened mainly for educational institutes of all levels.




